Alexander studied at the Vancouver Art School and Langara College art dept. and then graduated with a BFA from Notre Dame University, and the University of Saskatchewan with an MFA.

In 1980 he moved from British Columbia to Saskatoon for 23 years. He received his Masters degree while researching in New York, London, Paris and Boston. He has travelled the world to attend his exhibitions, conduct lectures and drawing and painting research in the north.

During the the 90's and 2000's he travelled in the Canadian arctic repeatedly and later in 1998 he resided in Iceland where he had a public exhibition.

In 2012 Alexander resided as a guest artist at The Helene Wurlitzer Foundation there he completed a large body drawings that were show at the Hulse, Warman Gallery in Taos, New Mexico in 2013, the Goodwin Fine Arts in Denver Colorado in 2015 and the Kelowna Public Art Gallery in 2016.

We have had the great pleasure of exhibiting David's work for the last 20 years. The current exhibition, 'Revisiting', aims to showcase a series of paintings executed during that time frame. Mountains, trees, and water are all focal points of Alexander's practice. The series of 'wet' paintings are of particular interest, as a son of a tugboat operator Alexander's life-long love of water surfaces and the interaction of the sky, landscape, and 'litter' on their reflective surfaces. Mountain and forest images dramatically portray his love of the outdoors, rockface images focus on the forms that compose the mountain, not just how pretty they are. Alexander varies the format of each work, vertical, horizontal, and wide panoramic scenes that evoke not just what mountains look like, but more importantly what it feels like to be on them, both physically and emotionally.
